Welcome to Year 1. The children have made a fantastic start to the year already and we look forward to seeing them progress through the year. Your child will receive homework once a half term. This is intended to last the half term so that you can stagger your child's learning through the weeks to support them. There may be learning that is sent home for your children that will support your children with their own individual learning journeys but this is something your child's class teacher will talk to you about.

This half term your child will be investigating the enquiry question: '<u>What makes me unique?</u>' Here they will be thinking about themselves and what makes them special.

Reading

Reading remains a priority for us in Year 1 as it underpins many of the other subjects. We ask that you hear your child read five times a week and ask that you use the phonics book that is sent home provided by the school. We recognise that not all children will read whole texts and that some children may only read for short periods this is fully supported by the school and we suggest that initially one or two pages per evening is reasonable for this point in the year. More information on how to use the phonics decodable books will follow shortly.

Please sign your child's reading record once they have read and let us know what it was they have done. This will be celebrated in class and the children will have a chance to earn themselves reading badges. Your child will receive reading badges for them reading the whole book. All children make a fresh start each year and we look forward to the children collecting their first badge after 10 books have been read.

This half term in school we are also looking at stories written by the authors below: we would also like to encourage your child to read any book by the following authors:

Martin Waddell Julia Donaldson Jill Murphy Oliver Jeffers Eric Carl Some of these stories can also be found on Youtube, and we also have some in our school library.
