Year 4 - Jacob- "I want to show appreciation to Damian for being my friend."


Year 5 - Daisy, "I want to show appreciation to Ryleigh for supporting me on the playground to have fun"

Hamwic Education Trust are now consulting on the Infant/Primary Admissions Policy, Southampton Partnerships for 2027 – 2028. The consultation ends on 24th January 2026. There are no changes to PAN or oversubscription criteria for Weston Shore Infant School or Weston Park Primary School. There is a proposed reduction in PAN to 60 for Glenfield Infant School.
