Year 3 - Rueben - "I appreciate Oliver P helping me to feel better and look my smartest when I was feeling uncertain about something.


Year 4 - Laynie - "I want to show appreciation to Frances because she has been a good friend to me and is also in my Basketball team at lunchtimes."
